

Survey Work Continues

In April 2019, we notified adjoining landowners of survey work occurring in the utility-owned project rights-of-way between Schodack and Pleasant Valley. Since then, several survey efforts have been completed: photography, noise testing, and environmental surveys. LIDAR (taking aerial photographs of the project rights-of-way) will begin in **August 2019**. Archeological shovel testing will begin in **late summer/early fall 2019**. Geotechnical testing (soil borings) is planned to begin in **fall 2019**. Please note that timelines for this work could shift. All efforts will help to inform the engineering and permitting of the project.

Initial Municipal Outreach Completed

Over the past several months, the NYES outreach team has met with municipal leaders along the project route, including all town supervisors, to reintroduce the project. The NYES team also made presentations to (as of August) all town boards along the route, describing the core components of the project, and the timeline from permitting to construction. Please stay tuned for future meetings to discuss the project.

Article VII Application

The NYES team plans to submit an Article VII application to site and build the project in **fall 2019**. When the application is submitted, neighboring landowners and residents will receive a notice. Opportunities to formally participate in this process will also be made available and updated on our project website.

NYES is a proposed 54-mile transmission line upgrade from Schodack to Pleasant Valley that will stay within existing utility rights-of-way. NYES will unbottle New York's electric grid and facilitate the flow of clean energy, helping to meet key environmental and economic goals, while providing for a more reliable, resilient system.

Door-Knocking & Community Meetings

Our outreach team will be visiting each property (residence/business) that abuts the project route starting **August 14th**. The team will be providing key details on the project and answering questions. For safety, NYES project team members will carry photo identification.

Also, please be on the lookout for an invitation to community meetings this fall. These will be opportunities to meet the subject matter experts on the project team and ask questions. More information on these meetings will hit mailboxes toward the end of the summer.
